


HOT WAX YOUR SKIS & SNOWBOARD

A Library Survival Guide





Hey! Did you tune your edges? Do that first!





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Brass Brush: With firm brush strokes, work down your board.



Citrus Cleaner: Apply cleaner to base and wipe with cloth.



Hot Scrape: Apply hot wax, run iron over base, then scrape off wax immediately.



Hold wax against the iron and let hot melted wax drip on base or 'crayon' it on.



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Run iron over the base with constant motion, getting entire base covered in wax





Enjoy a brew while you let wax cool for about 30 mins.
You've earned it:)





We wax our boards to protect them as well as to glide fast; the base of your board has a "structure" that absorbs wax. To the observer it has striations that we want to see at the end of this process.




Scrape wax off base with plastic scraper.
Keep scraping until no wax comes off!



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Don't worry--you are not undoing all your work! You are simply scraping off any excess wax that didn't absorb into the base.



Brush base with a horse hair brush (or nylon brush) tip to tail
